Now financial and technical assistance is being provided to us to help keep deer

off the farm. With very few people hunting in this area the population of deer has now reached an all time high. Can you blame them though? Tender lettuces, juicy beets, and carrots to them must taste superior to field corn and soybeans. The project entails installing an electric fence around some of the crops that deer specifically are attracted to. With the time required to install and maintain the fence we hope that our efforts will provide some positive results.
